## Recent Projects and Research in Progress

*Aging, Place, and Care: The Lives and Hopes of Himalayan Elders in an Age of Migration.* NSF funded team project that challenges major paradigms in social gerontology by documenting the variable effects that out-migration is having on family-based care systems across the Himalayan region and in migration destinations such as Kathmandu and New York City.

*The Legacy of Pema Döndrub.* Initial funding through Olin Library's Newman Exploration Travel Fund. The project involves translating and analyzing the biography of a 17<sup>th</sup>-century Buddhist lama from Nubri, Nepal, recording oral history, and documenting his legacy through monasteries and statues. It overlaps with another project, *Tibetan Songs of Spiritual Experience*, with ethnomusicologist Mason Brown that studies living expressions of *mgur*, a Tibetan verse genre that has been mainly viewed as a textual tradition.

*Milk with Altitude.* Funded by NSF (2015-18), the project with PI E.A. Quinn (Washington University in St. Louis) investigates the association between mother's milk, infant growth, and adaptation to a high-altitude environment in Nubri, Nepal. Publications are ongoing.

*Himalayan and Tibetan Demography.* Various ongoing studies documenting contemporary demographic changes in the Himalayan region and the historical demography of Tibetan populations. Topics include migration and social change, marital migration, lama longevity, and population churn.
